Course 1: Train and Bus Journey in Gifu



On your first full day in Gifu, you'll explore Nakatsugawa and the picturesque post town of Magome, both rich in samurai history and closely linked to the historic Nakasendo Trail.

1) Nakatsugawa || 中津川



Nakatsugawa is a historic town at the start of the **Nakasendo Trail**, known for its natural beauty and traditional atmosphere. Rich in history, it attracts visitors eager to walk the same paths once used by samurai and traders. The town offers scenic mountain views, cultural landmarks, and great **hiking opportunities**, making it the perfect gateway to explore Gifu's countryside.

② Magome||馬籠



Magome is a picturesque post town along the Nakasendo Trail, beautifully preserved to reflect the Edo period.
Located in the mountains, it features traditional wooden houses, shops, and tea houses along its main street. A walk through Magome feels like stepping back in time, offering visitors a chance to experience Japan's rural charm and explore part of the historic trail.

Day three takes you to Gero Onsen, a historic hot spring town with over 1,000 years of history.

Known as one of Japan's "Three Great Onsen," it was a favorite retreat for samurai for a long period, offering relaxing, healing waters.

① Gero Onsen || 下呂温泉



Gero Onsen is famous for its high-quality hot springs, warm hospitality, nostalgic rural scenery, delicious local cuisine, and charming town walks. One of the highlights of visiting Gero is enjoying a street food tour the town as you explore.

② Osaka no Taki||小坂の滝



Osaka no Taki refers to Osaka Town, which boasts over 200 waterfalls with drops of 5 meters or more, making it one of Japan's top waterfall-rich areas. The Iwate Gorge, featuring the 72-meter Iwatedake cliff, offers scenic walking paths for visitors to enjoy the waterfalls and the region's clear streams.

② Hida Beef ||飛騨牛



Hida Beef is a high-quality Wagyu beef from Gifu Prefecture, known for its rich marbling, tender texture, and exquisite flavor. Raised with care, it is a prized delicacy in Japan, often enjoyed in dishes like steaks, sukiyaki, and shabu-shabu.

1 Shirakawago|| 白川郷

These unique, steep-roofed structures were designed to withstand heavy snowfall. The village, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, offers a picturesque glimpse into rural Japan's past.
